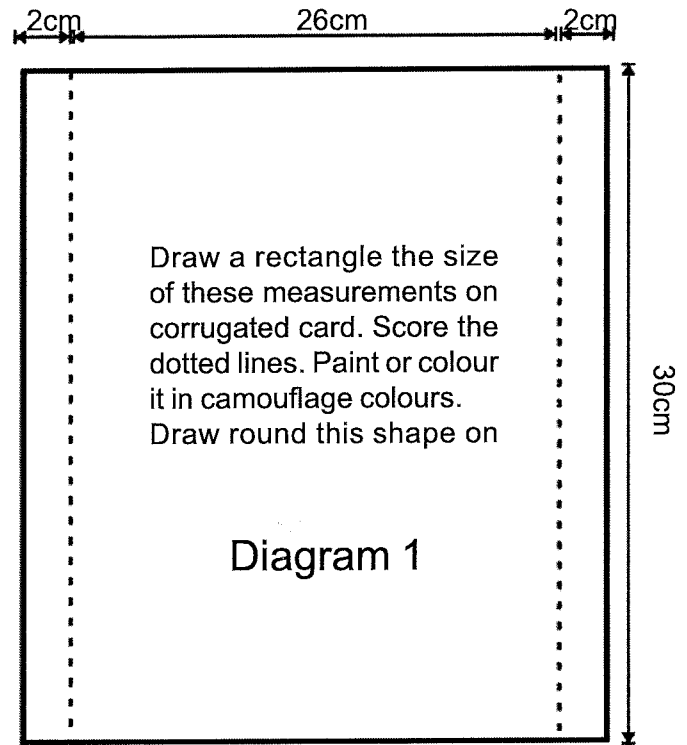
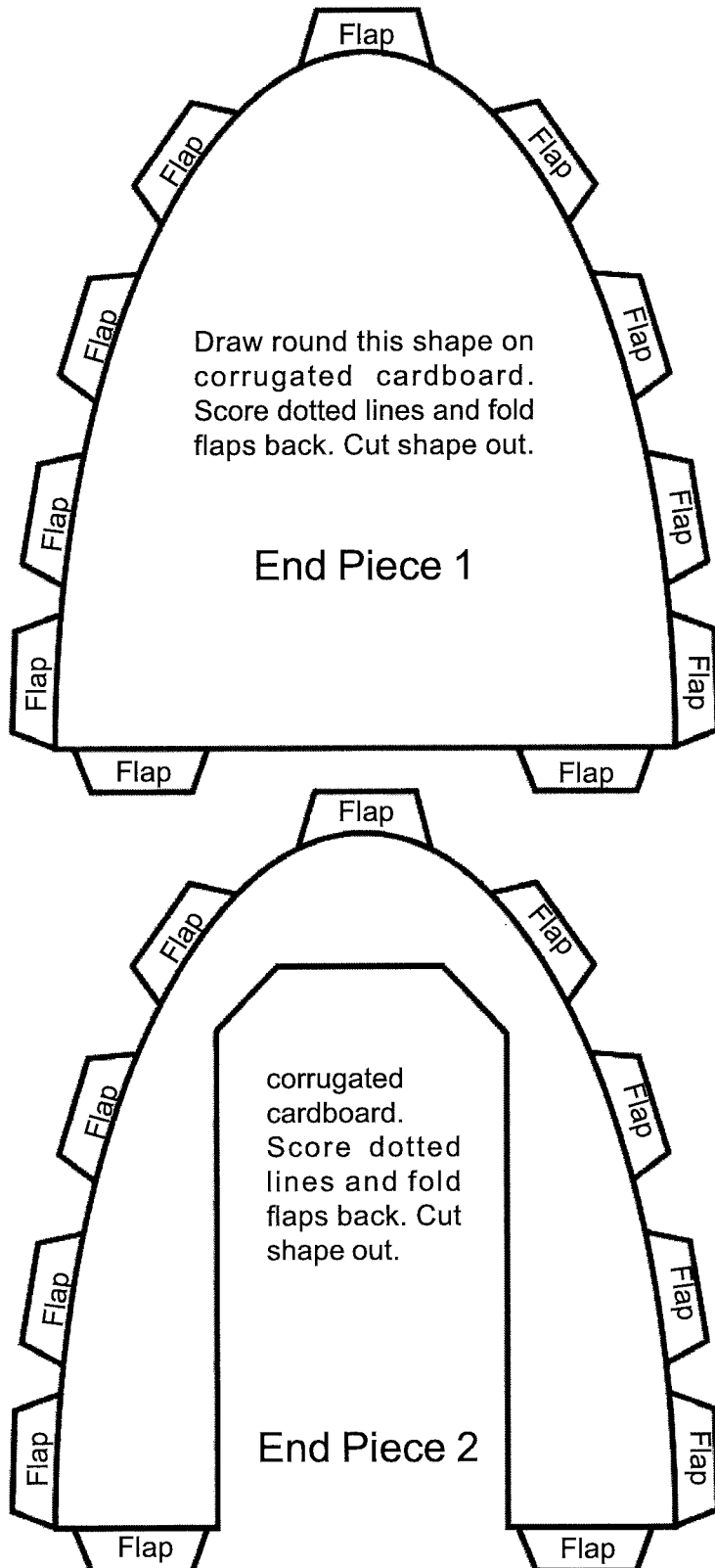


Make a Model Anderton Air Raid Shelter

YOU WILL NEED.

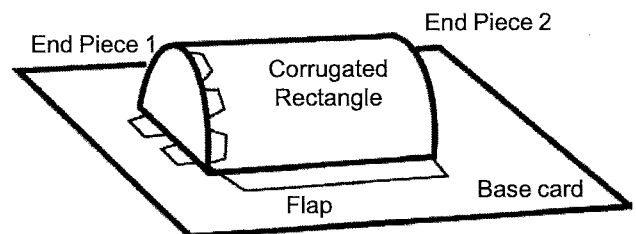
A piece of corrugated cardboard 30cm by 30cm, a piece of stiff card 40cm by 40cm, an empty cereal box, pencil scissors, glue, paints, crayons or felt tips.



INSTRUCTIONS

Cut out a piece of corrugated cardboard the size of diagram.1.

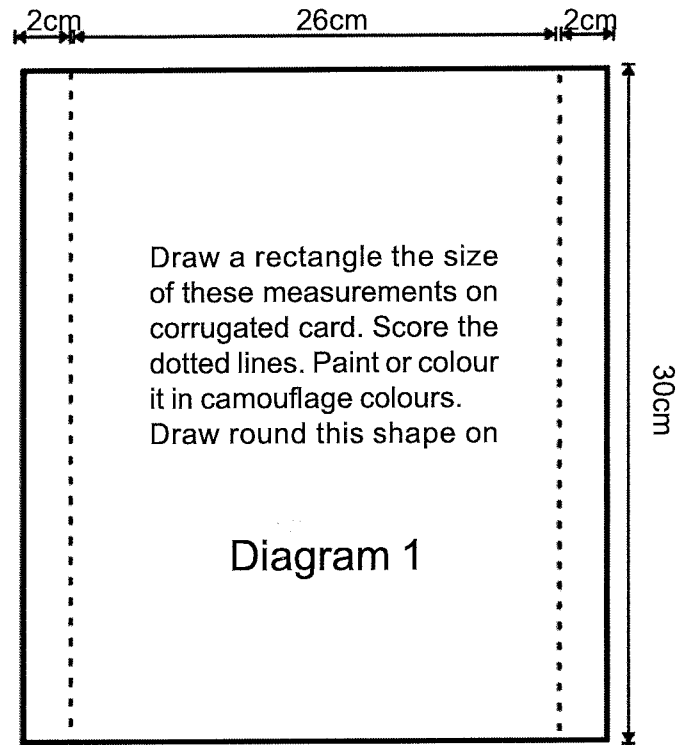
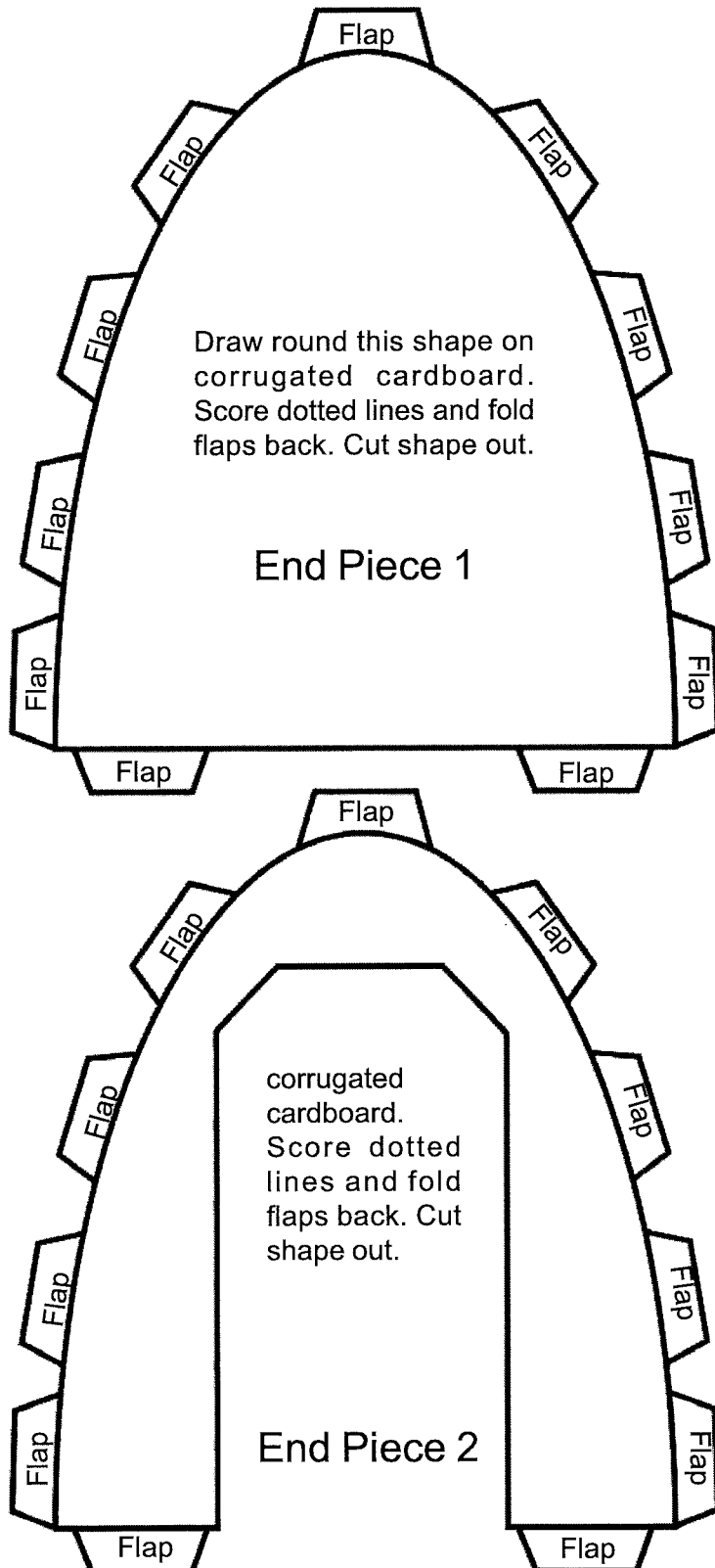
Score along the dotted lines. Paint or colour the outside in camouflage colours. Let it dry properly. Draw round end pieces 1 & 2 on the corrugated card, colour them in camouflage, let dry well. Stick the flaps of your roof section curved around end piece 1. Glue this to your base card. Research what furniture or artefacts were kept in a shelter, make them out of the cereal box and glue them inside your shelter. Glue end piece 2 to the roof piece and base card using the flaps. Add any trees, bushes or flowers made out of the cereal box to the base plate. Label your shelter carefully.
